She was part of a group show at the Archival Gallery in January 2019. Her artwork was at the 2019 California State Fair Fine Arts Show and has received an Award of Merit for her piece. Several of her artworks are at private collections. She is a member of the Pastel Society of the West Coast (PSWC), the Folsom Arts Association (FAA) and the El Dorado Hills Art Association (EDHAA). She has served as a recording Secretary for the PSWC (2013-2017).
